Remedial classes for slow learners


Abstract

Slow learners are identified by the students performance in Mid/Term examinations and previous semester end examinations. Generally 60% of the marks in Mid examinations is considered as the threshold. Similarly students having backlogs in their previous semester end examinations can be also considered as slow learners. Special classes will be conducted after college hours for these students to revise the topics of ongoing semester subjects. Counselors also will maintain special attention on these students. Remedial classes schedules will be announced by departments and attendance of these students for the class work will be monitored.

- 1. Faculty can exempt any student in this list for proper reason and write the reason in the 3 columns given for attendance.
- 2. Faculty members are requested to submit the attendance status (No of students present / No of students need to attend) of slow learner classes to attender.
- 3. Submit the Duly signed attendance sheet to the Academics coordinator at the end of all the classes.
- 4. All faculty members who are handling the slow learner classes are requested to prepare them well for next week tests and MID examinations and make sure to score good marks.
- 5. All the faculty members are requested to motivate the slow learners of their subject to attend the slow learner classes. If any student is absent then intimate to counsellors.
- 6. Counsellors are requested to find out the reason and intimate to parents if required.

Note to slow learner students: These classes are arranged for your benefit only. So make use of them and this attendance will be added to you. If you don't attend the slow learner classes then action will be taken by corresponding subject teacher and counsellor.

The Summer Semester 2019 Program is proposed to be conducted from 24th May 2019 to 14th June 2019 (Including both the days). To facilitate proper planning and preparations, the following information is enclosed for HoDs reference.

- 1. List of subjects having students internal marks less than 21: There are 258 such subjects as per details enclosed. HoDs can use these details to indentify subjects to be offered. (Annexure 1 is abstract details, Annexure 2 is sorted on branch wise, Annexure 3 sorted on student strength wise).
- 2. 30% of department faculty may be assigned for Summer Semester work, so that others can concentrate on the research work and other department activities during that period.
- 3. The maximum number of courses a student can register is three. In addition to these, student can register for 2 Labs also.
- 4. Two mid examinations will be conducted during summer semester for 30 marks each. 75% marks of the best mid examination and 25% marks of the other mid examination will be considered for awarding the final 40 marks.
- 5. If a student has less than 80% attendance in any subject, internal marks for that subject will not be considered. Condonation of shortage of attendance not allowed.
- 6. HoDs should note that this is a proposal only and details will be finalized during DDH Meetings.
